NOTE: ONLY ONE PARENT/FAMILY OF U10/U12 ATHLETES WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SHIAI FOR THE U10/U12 COMPETITION. WHEN REGISTERING THEIR CHILD ON TRACKIE, THE ATTENDING PARENT'S NAME MUST BE PROVIDED AS THEY ARE THE ONLY ONE WHO WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE TOURNAMENT FLOOR AS LIMITED CAPACITY IS CURRENTLY STILL IN EFFECT. A WRIST BAND WILL BE PUT ON THAT PARENT AT THE FRIDAY NIGHT CHECK-IN. IF THE WRISTBAND IS LOST OR REMOVED, IT WILL NOT BE REPLACED. IF TAMPERED WITH, THE PARENT WILL NO LONGER BE ALLOWED IN THE SHIAI. NO SUBSTITUTIONS ARE ALLOWED. THE WRISTBAND IS NOT TRANSFERRABLE. THE REGISTERED PARENT IS THE ONLY ONE WHO CAN PICK UP AND WEAR THE PROVIDED WRIST BAND.

Tournament Guidelines & Rules

- IJF rules apply. Judo Canada and Judo Alberta regulations as of the tournament date are enforced. The Tournament Director reserves the right to make any changes in the best interest of the event and contestants.
- White & blue judogis are <u>mandatory</u> for U16 & older. Exception: Veterans & Senior Novice Men.
- White judogi is mandatory for U10, U12, U14, Veterans and Novice Senior. Blue judogi is optional for 2nd name called.
- U14, U18, U21 & Veteran athletes who fight in the same weight category in U16 or Senior division on Sunday, will NOT have to weigh in twice BUT Check-in is required on Saturday by 3:30 PM for Sunday divisions. Athlete, coach or another designate can confirm Sunday competition attendance at Registration table.
- U10 & U12 Competitors or designate must check in before 7 PM Friday, April 22 and provide current Judo Canada membership card at the Volunteer/T-shirt table.
- U10 & U12 can be mixed gender matches. Where possible, U10 & U12 groups will be made of up to 4 judokas of like registered weight. Submission of incorrect/guessed weights may eliminate a judoka from participating.
- Each Club Sensei is responsible to check their U10/U12 athletes weight on Trackie for accuracy and advise of changes/errors before April 9, 2022.

IF NEEDED, COMPETITION TIME BLOCKS WILL BE RELEASED AFTER REGISTRATION CLOSES. ONLY ATTEND THE SHIAI 30 MINUTES BEFORE YOUR DIVISION START TIME.





Match Lengths & Determination

U10 & U12: 1.5-minute non-stop matches U14/U16/Veterans: 3-minute matches U18/U21/Senior: 4-minute matches

Seeding: Top 4 athletes in Senior divisions based on Judo Canada's points system

Divisions of 2: best 2 out of 3
Divisions of 3, 4 and 5: round robin
Divisions of 6 and 7: double pool

Divisions of 8 or more: modified double knockout

U10 & U12: custom medals for all competitors

U14: custom medals for 1st, 2nd & 3rd **U16 & older per Judo Canada policy:**

➤ 1 competitor: no medal

> 2 competitors: 2 medals – providing that both won a bout

> 3 competitors: 3 medals - providing that three won at least one bout

4 competitors: 3 medals5 competitors: 3 medals

➤ 6 & more competitors: 4 medals

Covid-19 Protocols (Revised February 19, 2022)

The following changes apply to sanctioned Level A and Level B events as contained in the Judo Canada SANCTIONING POLICY & TOURNAMENT STANDARDS for the 2021 - 2022 season.

The organizers of sanctioned events Levels A and B must add to the entry requirements and standards the following mandatory Coronavirus mitigating strategies: For athletes and referees:

- 1) All athletes and referees must submit a written Coronavirus declaration in the approved form, signed, and in the case of minors, signed by the participant's parent or legal guardian.
- 2) Wear a mask at all times, except when warming up and competing, or when refereeing.

For all other participants (including but not limited to, coaches, organizers, volunteers, medical team, etc.)

- 1) All other participants must submit a written Coronavirus declaration in the approved form, signed, and in the case of minors, signed by the participant's parent or legal guardian.
- 2) Always wear a mask.

Please note we will not be allowed to have spectators on the tournament floor, but there is a viewing area around and overlooking the Ice Palace. Only athletes, coaches, referees, medical staff and volunteers will be allowed access to the tournament site. They may need to show ID and/or vaccination QR codes at the entrances to the facility.

Note: These requirements apply in addition to any provincial public health measures already in place. These measures are implemented immediately and will be maintained until the circumstances permit their variation or removal.
