Eligibility

Open to all members of Judo Provincial/Territorial Associations and IJF Associations.

Minimum rank is YELLOW.

Rules

- The 2022 IJF [Kata competition criteria for the evaluation](#) will be used to judge
- White judogi only
- Couples may be made up of any gender. No separate divisions
- Both Tori and Uke must be of the same age of the kata division.
- A U16 may compete in U23 and a U23 may complete in Senior but not the reverse.
- Tori and Uke may compete together in two (2) katas in the same division but not on another team for the same kata in the same division.
- No maximum number of kata per participants.
- Females must wear a long white, short sleeve t-shirt with a circular collar (no "V" necks).

Surfaces

A 50 cm piece of white tape will be fixed on the centre of the competition area 6 meters apart to indicate the starting position for both Tori and Uke. The center will also be marked.

Covid-19 Protocols (Revised February 19, 2022)

The following changes apply to sanctioned Level A and Level B events as contained in the Judo Canada SANCTIONING POLICY & TOURNAMENT STANDARDS for the 2021 - 2022 season.

The organizers of sanctioned events Levels A and B must add to the entry requirements and standards the following mandatory Coronavirus mitigating strategies: For athletes and referees:

- 1) All athletes and referees must submit a written Coronavirus declaration in the approved form, signed, and in the case of minors, signed by the participant's parent or legal guardian.
- 2) Wear a mask at all times, except when warming up and competing, or when refereeing.

For all other participants (including but not limited to, coaches, organizers, volunteers, medical team, etc.)

- 1) All other participants must submit a written Coronavirus declaration in the approved form, signed, and in the case of minors, signed by the participant's parent or legal guardian.
- 2) Always wear a mask.

Please note we will not be allowed to have spectators on the tournament floor, but there is a viewing area around and overlooking the Ice Palace. Only athletes, coaches, referees, medical staff and volunteers will be allowed access to the tournament site. They may need to show ID and/or vaccination QR codes at the entrances to the facility.

Note: These requirements apply in addition to any provincial public health measures already in place. These measures are implemented immediately and will be maintained until the circumstances permit their variation or removal.
