We have had yet another a very interesting and trying time for a portion of the year in Alberta due to the Covid-19 outbreak. First and foremost, I can't thank Ewan Beaton enough. 

Registrar's Report

Judo Alberta has been growing each year both in the past and after Covid. We are seeing clubs and its members starting to rejuvenate and come back to what is 'normal'.

Registrations continue on Trackie with Judo Canada's database. Clubs have the option of using Trackie simply as a registration site where a club registrar manages all registrations and collects fees; or it can be used a registration and payment site for a club with a minimum cost that can be passed along to the registering member. It is strongly recommended one of these registration procedures be used vs. allowing members to register themselves and then not submit payment to the club as the club will be responsible for those fees. When registrations are submitted on Trackie, they are final and non-refundable. Membership cards were issued by Judo Canada.

The 2021-2022 fees remained the same from both Judo Canada and Judo Alberta. A few clubs did not register.

Judo Alberta's own database continues to be used for promotions. Even though member promotions are listed on Trackie, they are not valid until submitted to Judo Alberta. It remains the ensure that promotions are

The 2021/2022 season was an exciting season for programming and opportunities for our female judoka in Judo Alberta.

Congratulations to Sensei Laurie Wiltshire on her promotion to Godan this season.

Congratulations to Sensei Tammy Thornton on her achievement of IJF A- International referee license (the highest referee credential) and appointment to Judo Canada Referee Commission.

As pandemic advice was evolving, our annual Girls Camp became one-day-only events in Calgary and Edmonton, featuring Paralympian Tokyo 2020 silver medallist Priscilla Gagne. 30 judokas from Hiro's, Ishi Yama, Airdrie Eidokan, Medicine Hat, Raymond and Barracuda Judo Club came to the Calgary day, hosted by Hiro's Judo Club, and 35 judoka attended the Edmonton day from Tokugawa, Tolide, Kodokwai, Ryu Senshi, St. Albert, and Grande Prairie judo clubs. Thank you to Hiro's Judo Club and Tokugawa for hosting these special days.

Priscilla came to Alberta a few days prior to the camp to participate with the Deguchi sister visit, trained with Hiro's, visited schools and Barracuda Judo Club, and stayed on for the spring prenationals training camp in Lethbridge.

Judo Alberta hosted a Beginner Female Referee Summit in Crowsnest Pass and Pincher Creek for female judoka from western Canada. Judoka from Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta gathered for three days for classroom theory, video review and tatami sessions as well as some hiking in Coleman, Frank, and Waterton. Refereeing is a way to learn the philosophies and rules of judo, as well as give back to ensure events run smoothly and quality judo is promoted. This year, we have a new committee chair, new committee membership, and a new committee name. Thank you to Alexandra Gagnon and Michelle Grisales for joining me on this committee.

This committee has been known as Women's Committee or Female Committee. High Performance Coach and Coaching Committee Report

Judo Alberta and Judo Canada will be feeling the effects of Covid-19 for the years to come. We will have to work hard and be creative to regain our membership. The goal will be to continue grow in members coming out of Covid-19, but this will take a willingness for clubs to embrace marketing, find new coaches, develop different classes and to push judoka to open their own clubs / satellite clubs.

During the 2021-2022 season we experienced several government restrictions / changes that interrupted the competition season. Judo was back but it was far from back to normal. With Covid-19 cases rising in the fall of 2021 we were not able to organize a competition in the province until the Provincial Championships on March 25/26, 2022, in Lethbridge. Regions in Alberta were affected differently by covid-19 with some regions having larger numbers and other regions having moderate numbers. This effect how clubs delt with closures and restrictions for their judo clubs, some clubs felt little effect and some clubs were affected deeply. Every club/coach did their best dealing with the covid-19 reality they were living in. The Elite National Championships were cancelled in Edmonton due to the rise in Covid-19 cases / several judo clubs shut their doors during this time. It has not been easy!

Even though it was an abbreviated season there were times when it was very busy. Many of the coaches were happy to be busy but were tired at the end of the season. We had lost our judo endurance.

My year was busy since we needed to find ways to provide athletes with some sort of judo volume and experience. I was also asked several times to follow our Alberta National Team juniors to international competitions, this was a great development because it allowed me the opportunity to see where the rest of the judo world was regarding their development.

NCCP Committee Report

Due to Covid restrictions, no NCCP courses were held in 2021. A Dojo Assistant course was scheduled for late August in 2022, but unfortunately, we did not have enough participants sign up for the course to make it viable. In the coming year we are hoping to resume offering NCCP courses at least twice a year.

NCCP Coach evaluations were held in person or over Zoom for several coaches in 2021/2022. Mohammed Abida (Hiro's) was certified as a dojo instructor in 2021 but was not listed in the AGM report last year. Franz Lennarson (Tokugawa) successfully completed his evaluation and was certified as a Dojo Instructor. Also, Peter Dajavs (Tokugawa), David Wu (Tokugawa), and Ivan Ho (Ishiyama) were certified as Dojo Assistants.

1. **Nature of Operations**

The Alberta Kodokan Black Belt Association is a non-profit organization incorporated under the Societies Act of Alberta. Operations are governed by an elected board.

2. **Future Fund**

The Future Fund is a restricted fund that is used to generate interest income that, with proper authorization, may be withdrawn or reinvested in the Fund. The purpose of the Fund is to assist Judo Alberta in achieving financial self-sufficiency. See Schedule 2.

General Investments 3.

Book value as of Aug 31 2022 was \$238681.96. This includes \$100 000 from the Future Fund. If the value of the investments drop below \$100 000, the executive will use general revenue to top up the investment to the above amount. Currently, interest from this account gets deposited back into the investment.

4. Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable consists of amounts owing from clubs for athlete expenses for various out of province tournaments. See Schedule 4 for details.

5. Inventory

Past inventory was made up of tracksuits and equipment Judo Alberta owns. The inventory and equipment have now been divided to show it separately. All current inventory was written off.

6. Equipment

This includes equipment from Judo Shiai, Referee CARE, Panams, and 2016,2017 Nationals. It is depreciated at 10% the first year and then 14% thereafter.

7. **Vehicle and Depreciation**

The original cost of the vehicle has been depreciated at a 30% annual declining balance, pro rated for the number of months of ownership during the current fiscal year.

8. Tom Greenway Fund

The Tom Greenway Fund is now encompassed in the Judo Alberta yearly Coaching Committee budget. The Fund provides annual awards(2x\$400) to the highest point total U20 athletes. It is presented at the Florence Senda Junior Tournament. The separate back account associated with this fund is now closed.

9. Deferred Revenue

Deferred Revenue is comprised of monies received from CWG Grant (23, 571) and any other income as required. The yearly Ab Sport grant money is distributed in March and July. Casino money usually comes every 2 years.
